

Run and Climb: Team Endeavor Indoor Climbing and Cross Country

"Don't fall!" - Everyone who has ever climbed, probably

Do you like running, climbing or any combination of the two? Well boy howdy are you in luck, because we have just thing thing/s for you! Did you know Endeavor has an indoor climbing team AND a cross-country (running, not skiing) team? It's true! We do! And they are AWESOME! But what are they, you may ask, and how do I get involved?



The Endeavor Cross Country team, led by Coach Ganzenhuber, meets a couple times a week for practice and participates in regular running meets against other teams from the area. If you are on the team, you will also be requried to follow a work-out plan to help you stay in tip-top, ready-to-run shape. In addition to getting and staying in shape, you will also learn impoirtant life skills such as teamwork, perserverance, consistancy, dedication and, you will, of course, have tons of fun (especially when you're not being chased by evil hissing geese. Wait, this has never happened to you? Oh just me? Ok.)! If all this sounds right up your alley, the Endeavor Cross-Country team might just be for you!

If. however, you like your movement to be more vertically focused, and/or you were that kid in elementary school that climbed everything in sight, the Indoor Climbing team might be for you! Led by Coach Mulick (that's me!), we meet weekly at MetalMark Indoor Climbing Gym to practice two types of climbing: top-roping and bouldering. Top-roping involes being tied into a rope and climbing longer, more endurance-testing courses wheras bouldering is shorter climbs not involling a harness that test skill and technique. We also compete in monthly competitions agains other local schools, and, not to brag, but we usually win. In climbing, you will learn teamwork, trust, perserverance and most importantly, how to be comfortable hanging 30 feet up from just a caribiner at your waist (it's not as bad as it sounds! Trust me! I'm a big old scaredy cat and even I can do it!). So if this sounds like your bag, try out for the climbing (not falling!!) team!

Although this year's season is coming to a close, we're going to be on the lookout for new climbers and runners for next season. We hope to see you at tryouts, Fall 2024!



Google Takeout Policy 2024 Graduating Seniors and Departing Students

Dear Families,

As our seniors prepare to leave our campus, we want to ensure that you are aware that their email and Google accounts will no longer be active after July 19, 2024 [their school-issued accounts]. If you wish to keep any of the information in that account, it is recommended that you download or transfer any essential documents to a secondary account [Dropbox, Microsoft, Google, etc.]. Our IT Department will not provide support for exporting or transferring those files.

Our seniors have until July 19, 2024, to export those files. These accounts will be suspended at that point [Gmail, Google Drive, Google Docs, Google Sheets, Google Slides, etc.].

You are not required to transfer anything. However, if you have a resume, a cover letter, a project, a picture, a video, or a file of any kind that is important to you, we encourage you to download or transfer those items.

How can I do this?

1) If you log into your Google account from a personal computer, simply download any of those files to that computer [<u>https://takeout.google.com/</u>].

2) Transferring that content to another cloud-based account is another option that may work for you [https://takeout.google.com/transfer]. Google can transfer those files for you. Follow the steps inside that webpage to request that transfer. Depending on how many files you plan to transfer, this may take a few days. Try to plan accordingly.


